V4 - A822 Tomnagrew

A handful of houses on the opposite side of the glen have direct views onto the site, including Tomnagrew House. This view is characterised by agricultural fields in the foreground bisected by the public road, giving way to the riparian woodlands along the River Braan. Mature conifer and broadleaved trees are encountered in several locations along the public road. Little Findowie is visible on the lower ground, with the northern slopes of the site and Rose Craig rising above it. The coniferous shelterbelts to the east of the site are visible on the skyline.

V2 - A822 Borelick

This view is characterised by agricultural fields in the foreground, sloping down to the riparian woodlands along the Braan river valley, with rough grassland and moorland on the slopes of Airlich and Rose Craig in the middle distance. The mature coniferous shelterbelts within the site are visible on the skyline. Little Findowie steading is visible immediately below the site.

V1 - A822 West Bound

The site first comes into view from west-bound traffic after passing the Drumour Schoolhouse. Views onto the site are largely obscured by the broadleaved woodlands along the River Braan and on Airlich Hill. Only the higher, north facing slopes of Findowie Hill are visible from this point, with Dalreoch Hill and the ridge formed by Creag Bhorach and Creag Ghorm in the background.

V3 - A826 / A822 East Bound

This view is characterised by improved agricultural fields with scattered mature trees and riparian woodlands along the strath, giving way to hill grazing on the lower slopes of the site. The riparian woodland along the Dullator Burn is visible as the ground rises towards the summits of Rose Craig and Findowie Hill. The rocky outcrop of the Speiran is visible on the skyline, as are the shelterbelts on the middle ground below Rose Craig and Findowie Hill.

V6 - Little Rosecraig (internal)

There are attractive views from the abandoned steading of Rosecraig to the east of the site, looking south east towards Glen Shee. This view is mainly characterised by open moorland and the valley formed by the Shochie Burn.

V5 - Amulree

The site is completely obscured from view from Amulree by the intervening hills of Dalreoch and Creag Bhorach. This view is characterised by rolling moorland with scattered broadleaved woodland by the Girron Burn.

V7 - Other locations

Views from the south and south east are prevented by rising topography. Clear views over the site are available from the hills on the north side of Strathbraan. However there are no significant visual receptors in this locality.
